

# ST. CHARLES COMMUNITY COLLEGE TRANSFER GUIDE FOR MARYVILLE UNIVERSITY

## GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

- Students with an Associate of Arts (AA) degree or students who have completed the 42 hour general education block from St. Charles Community College will have fulfilled all of Maryville University's general education requirements.
- Students without an AA degree or students having any other AS or AAS degree must complete Maryville University's general education requirements as part of their degree completion program. Transfer course work will be evaluated on a course-by-course basis to determine equivalency. In general, courses numbered 100 or higher will transfer. The following guide should be followed by students not earning the AA degree:

### BACHELOR'S DEGREE GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

#### ST. CHARLES COMMUNITY COLLEGE COURSES

##### **SKILLS/PROCESSES FOR LITERACY (3-4 courses)**

1. ENG 101 & 102 English Composition I and II
2. SPE 101 Oral Communication  
(NOTE: not required for all majors. See University catalog for specific degree requirements)
3. MTH 121 Intermediate Algebra or higher  
(NOTE: all business majors must have college algebra. Some majors may require higher level math.)

##### **HUMANITIES/FINE ARTS (5 courses)**

1. Fine Arts – choose one 3-hour course from any music, art, or theatre
2. Literature or foreign language - choose any 3-hour literature or foreign language course
3. Philosophy - choose any 3-hour philosophy course
4. Two additional 3-hour courses from any of the humanities/fine arts courses in #1,2,3 directly above.  
(NOTE: some majors may require HIS 145 to fulfill humanities. See University catalog for specific degree requirements)

##### **NATURAL SCIENCE/QUANTITATIVE REASONING (2 courses)**

1. One 3 or 4-hour science course; lab not required except for Education majors.  
Choose from any biology, chemistry, geology, physical science, physics, and GEO 100 Principles of Geography.  
**NOTE:** see Maryville catalog for specific science requirements in Education, Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy, Nursing, Music Therapy
2. One additional 3 or 4-hour course from either a science or math above MTH 121.

##### **SOCIAL SCIENCE (3 courses)**

1. One 3-hour American history or American government course. Choose from: HIS 101, HIS 102, HIS 115, POL 101, POL 102.
2. Two additional 3-hour courses from the following areas:
  - Any anthropology
  - Any history
  - Any political science
  - Any sociology
  - Any psychology\*
  - Any economics

\* PSY 101 is required for Studio Art, Interior Design, Graphic Design, and interactive design majors

**GENERAL EDUCATION ELECTIVES** – 2 courses selected from any of above areas
