

Exhibit 2: Important Dates In The College History

- 1986 The formation of the college district and the election of the district Board of Trustees.
Dr. Donald D. Shook was selected to be the first president of St. Charles County Community College.
- 1987 The first classes were held in temporary locations.
- 1989 The Board of Trustees chose a 135-acre tract of land, located on Mid Rivers Mall Drive, for the site of a permanent campus, which was destined to be the county center of population growth for the year 2000.
- 1990 Groundbreaking for Phase 1 building construction.
- 1991 Moved from five temporary locations to new campus.
- 1992 The campus was officially dedicated and in Spring 1992 classes started.
- 1993 Voters approved bonding authority for building Phase 2 of the campus.
- 1994 The college broke ground for Phase 2, a two-building construction project that included the Fine Arts Building and the Continuing Education/Academic Center.
- 1995 Addition of a number of new vocational/technical programs, on-line library and campus-wide links to the Internet; the opening of Phase 2 buildings.
- 1996 Child Development Center opened in the Spring.
Dr. Donald D. Shook, first president, retired.
Dr. John M. McGuire was selected to become the second president.

1998 Voters gave the college bonding authority to construct and operate general classroom and physical education buildings, in addition to the Child Care Center, and athletic fields. (Phase 3).

The college purchased 65 acres adjacent to the 135-acre campus to help meet long-term educational needs.

1999 The college broke ground on the Phase 3 construction project. As part of the campus master plan initiative, the college completed its property purchase program, adding 22 acres. This increased the total campus size to 222 acres.

2000 The Phase 3 construction project continued on the College Center and the Technology Building.

2001 In January, the College opened the Technology Building, the College Center, and the addition to the Child Development Center and completed the athletic fields.

In April, the Board of Trustees approved a shortened public name—St. Charles Community College. A new logo was also approved.

The May 2001 graduation ceremony, held in the College Center, was the first class to graduate on the SCC campus. Dr. Donald D. Shook was guest speaker.

2002 In March 2002, the College received a 10-year accreditation from NCA.

The Board approved a new mission statement proposed by the Planning Council in October 2002.

2003 The College purchased 12.35 acres bringing the total campus size to 234.35 acres.

2004 In April, voters passed a no-tax increase bond issue and 2-cent levy transfer by a wide margin paving the way for the Phase IV campus expansion project to begin in summer.

2005 In June, the college broke ground on the Phase 4 construction project.

In September, the address of the College was changed officially from St. Peters to Cottleville, Missouri 63376. The College is located in Cottleville.

- 2006 In October 2006, SCC held its Phase 4 dedication ceremony for the Social Science Building (SSB), Visual Arts Building (VAB) and Café/Bookstore.
- 2007 In September, the College library was named the Paul and Helen Schnare Library in honor of the local couple who had a role in the birth of the College and of their continuing support of students through endowed scholarships.
