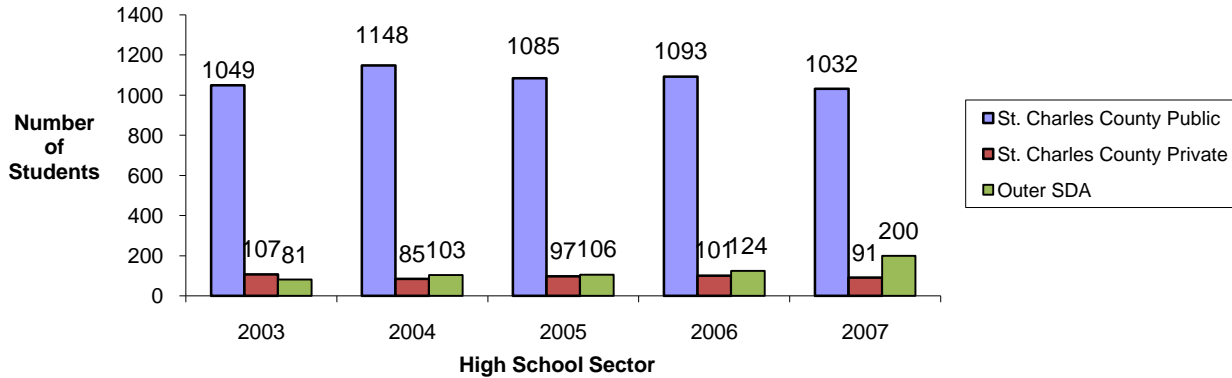
* New Student is defined as any student who is attending SCC for the first time in a particular Fall term.

** SDA stands for Service Delivery Area and includes all schools in the following counties: Pike, Lincoln, Montgomery & Callaway.

- (a) 226 unknown Fall 2003 SCC students had the following high school dispositions: 120 did not report a high school, 106 graduated with a GED.
- (b) 238 unknown Fall 2004 SCC students had the following high school dispositions: 155 did not report a high school, 83 graduated with a GED.
- (c) 208 unknown Fall 2005 SCC students had the following high school dispositions: 121 did not report a high school, 87 graduated with a GED.
- (d) 226 unknown Fall 2006 SCC students had the following high school dispositions: 138 did not report a high school, 88 graduated with a GED.
- (e) 292 unknown Fall 2007 SCC students had the following high school dispositions: 181 did not report a high school, 111 graduated with a GED.

Table 5 shows that the highest percent of first-time new students come from the St. Charles County public school sector. The percent of new students from St. Charles County public schools has ranged from 46% to 50% from 2003 to 2007. The percent of new students from St. Charles private schools has remained relatively stable at around 4%. New student growth in the Outer SDA areas has grown slightly from 4% in 2003 to 9% in 2007. Finally, the percent of new students from other states has remained fairly stable at about 9% from 2003 to 2007.

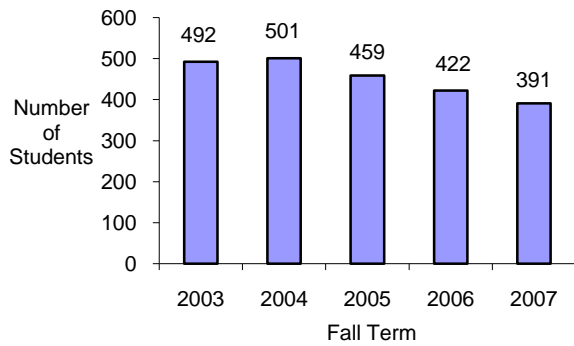
Graph 5.1: Number Of New Students Who Came From High Schools In SCC's District



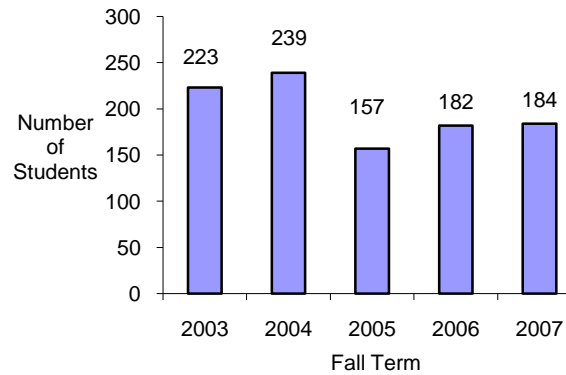
Graph 5.1 shows that the number of new students from St. Charles County public high schools grew at a linear rate from 2003 to 2004, leveled off in 2005 and 2006, and had a slight decline in 2007 with 71 fewer students than in 2006.

Graphs 5.2 and 5.3 show that the number of new students from Out-Of-District Missouri high schools and Out-Of-State high schools peaked in 2004.
