

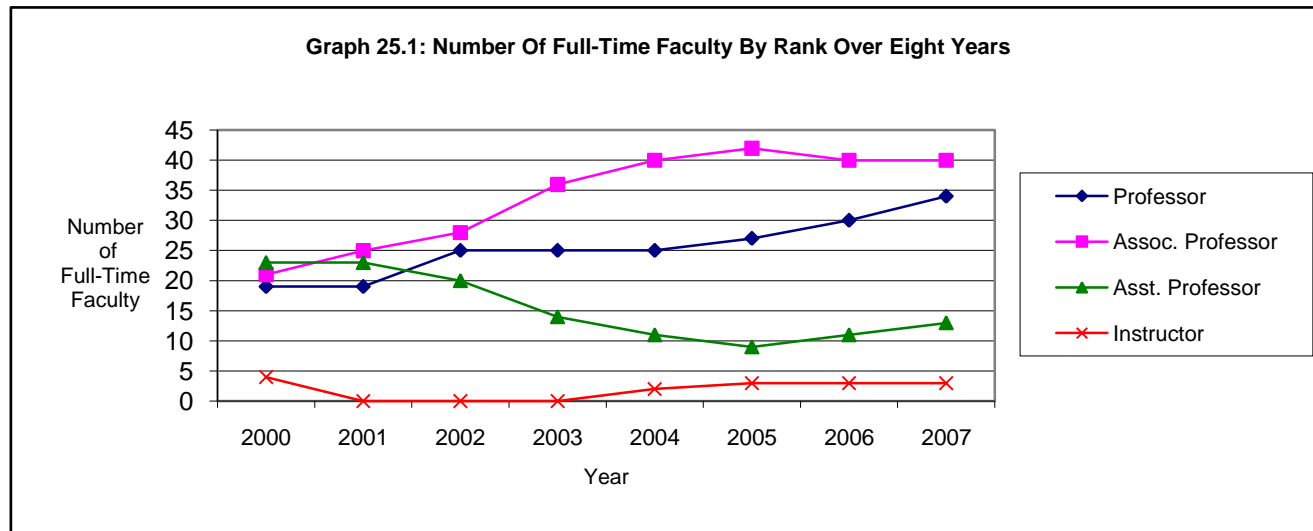

The number of full-time faculty has increased modestly each year except for 2000 and 2001. In 2007, the number of associate professors remained unchanged from 2006 while the number of assistant professors increased nearly back to the level it was in 2003. The percent of full professors has increased from 28% in 2000 to 38% in 2007.
