Pathway Considerations

Music – AFA in Music Pathways IMPORTANT INFORMATION..

- MUS-101 (Foundations of Music) is a prerequisite for entering the Theory/Ear-Training/Piano sequence which begins in ONLY
 THE FALL SEMESTER. A waiver for MUS-101 may be obtained by testing and/or equivalent experience as determined by the
 department chair. Students are encouraged to take High School Music Theory or the SCC MUS-101 course prior to
 entering the Music program at SCC.
- Course sequence is important. Each level of Ear Training is a co-requisite with each level of Music Theory. Each level of Piano Proficiency is intended to be taken concurrently with each level of Music Theory. The semester course schedules do not allow for these classes to be taken out of sequence.
- A grade of C or better is required in all sequential Music classes in order to move on to the next level. Earning lower than a C in any of these courses (Theory, Ear Training, Piano Proficiency) will delay your degree completion as each level is to be taken together in the same semester due to both scheduling limitations and curriculum.
- <u>For the lesson requirement:</u> The recommendation is 2 credits of lessons each semester in your primary instrument, though any combination of credits and secondary instruments may also count for degree completion. *Note*: The course section number refers to the number of semesters you have taken, with the last two digits referring to the number of credits each semester (-02 is 2 credits, while -01 is 1 credit).
- <u>Music Electives have varying credit hours</u> (see the approved list of courses), therefore your semester credits may not be exactly as seen on this sample pathway. **Discuss the electives best suited for your pathway with the department chair.** Any electives on the list may go towards degree completion.
- Recital and Concert Attendance This class must be taken and passed at least four times to earn your degree.
- NOTE: This pathway is for those students who wish to obtain the AFA in Music AND earn 11 additional credits to complete the CS in Musical Theatre. It is NOT necessary to earn the CS in Musical Theatre in order to earn the AFA degree. The CS in Musical Theatre may also be earned alone, but it should be noted that it is a Certificate program, not an Associate's degree.
- IMPORTANT: Those credits included in the C.S. but not the A.F.A. are NOT financial aid eligible.
- The Music Pathways provide flexibility for both transfer students and those who wish to deepen their musical knowledge and experience. See the department chair to discuss further!

Some Important Things About Pathways..

- Before registering for courses, see the Music Program Chair and then meet with an Academic Advisor. They will help make
 sure you're taking the right courses and sticking to your path. Always schedule your Music classes first and build the rest of
 your schedule around those offerings. The order in which you take your courses is important. Please check with your
 Academic Advisor to make sure you're not forgetting about course prerequisites.

- 3. To organize courses for your upcoming semesters or to register online, visit the Student Planning App in the SCC Portal.
- 4. If you have questions about your Financial Aid eligibility, contact a Financial Aid Counselor.
- The courses in this map were hand-selected to help you achieve your educational goals, which often includes course transfer. SCC does its best to ensure all courses transfer, though transferability is always up to the transfer institution. (See Core42 for exceptions to this rule.)
- 6. The simplest plan is for you to **stick to the path**. Changes to maps can be made, but please speak with an advisor, a teacher, and/or potential transfer institutions to ensure your substitutions fit your educational goals and needs.
- 7. Finding a career interest can help you find your Pathway. Consider visiting Career Services—they can help!
- 8. If you're interested in jobs based in Manufacturing & Industry, contact Workforce Development.
- 9. Degree completion is important! If you transfer early, be sure to "reverse-transfer" from your 4-year school back to SCC within one year so you can be awarded your A.F.A. degree.
