education is echoed every day at the Field to Table Institute. We are thankful for their generosity and support of our blossoming program.



IN MEMORY OF DR. BETTY TYREE OSIEK (APRIL 2, 1931 - MAY 1, 2023)

r. Betty Tyree Osiek was a friend to many at SCC, establishing a scholarship for students who came to SCC after earning their GED/HSE. She also volunteered in the English as a Second Language Program, and sang with the SCC Singers.

Thanks to her husband and mentor, Betty restarted her own educational journey in her late 20s – one that included earning a Ph.D. from Washington University. Her love of languages made her an inspirational educator at universities and took her to more than 72 different countries. She published two books, scholarly papers, articles and translations, as well as bibliographical reviews for the Library of Congress.

Betty received scholarships and fellowships, which made it possible for her to persevere. In return, she wanted to help others. She donated books to the SCC Library, and is a member of SCC's Legacy Society. Through her estate plans, Betty established an endowed scholarship for SCC students that will provide support to students in perpetuity.

Betty was featured in the 2015 Foundation Annual Report, and said during her interview, "I give because I want to help others like me who may have made some bad choices early in life but are seeking to develop themselves. I went from GED to Ph.D. in seven years and wanted to go as far as I could with teaching and publishing."
