# IMPLEMENTATION BEGINS FOR ANTHOLOGY, SCC'S NEW STUDENT INFORMATION SYSTEM



SCC is preparing to implement new technology products from Anthology, eventually replacing Ellucian Colleague as the college's software system for student information, recruiting, business office, cashier operations, fundraising, human resources and payroll.

Students will benefit from improved admissions procedures, course registration, ability to track graduation requirements and improved access to financial aid and billing information. Staff will enjoy streamlined management and reporting capabilities. During implementation, the college will move the system to the cloud, which will bring enhanced security and efficiency.

The steering committee for Anthology implementation is cochaired by Dave Leenhouts, Vice President for Student Affairs and Don Popham, SCC Executive Director of Information Technology. Members include Christina Cox, Tammie De Los Santos, Barb Fuerst, Oscar Lopez, Lindy McGuire, Rex McKanry, Stephen Nickell, Janet Ouellette, Nikki Ruckman, Betsy Schneider, David Seward, Amy Snydar and Jessica Trimborn.

Representatives from Anthology will lead discovery sessions with college employees May 31-June 2, commencing the multi-year project to create a fully developed system. The Board of Trustees approved the purchase of Anthology in June, 2022.
