SCC BREAKS GROUND ON NEW CAFÉ/MARKET AT DCC

As part of an expansion to its culinary and agricultural programs, St. Charles Community College broke ground on a new building on Wednesday, July 23, 2025 at their Dardenne Creek Campus. The Field to Table Institute at St. Charles Community College (SCC) has been so successful, the college is expanding facilities to include a new Café and Market that will serve as a lab for students and provide an innovative dining and market spot for the public.

"Due to substantial enrollment growth in our culinary, agriculture, and healthcare programs, our existing facilities at DCC have reached capacity," said Shelley Machens, Chief of External Campuses. "The addition of this new building enables us to better accommodate the needs of our students and community, enhance partnerships with local businesses, and expand our curriculum program offerings."

SCC President, Dr. Barbara Kavalier said, "In successful culinary programs, students have the opportunity to work in a restaurant and to practice preparing and serving food. In addition to classrooms and offices, this new building will feature a state-of-the-art café market as a lab for students and a resource for the community."

Dr. Kavalier also took a moment to recognize former Gov. Mike Parson, who approved the MoExcels Workforce Initiative grant that gave SCC the funds to begin working on the expansion, and SCC's Board of Trustees, who are, always focused on the future of the college and understand the importance of innovation in keeping SCC relevant

The new 14,000 square-foot facility will include 5,000 square feet of classrooms to support programming at the Dardenne Creek Campus and an expansive general lecture space to accommodate large classes, special presentations, and events.

"In an era where we face many food-related challenges, as well as opportunities, this institute brings together – on one campus – all the ingredients for learning the art, craft, and science of food," said John Mueller, Managing Partner, JEMA, SCC's architectural partner.

Mueller concluded with, "I hope the students and community take note of the innovative, creative, and indeed, groundbreaking initiatives brought here today by SCC."

SCC's Field to Table Institute, established in 2019, brings together culinary, agriculture, and healthcare, teaching the concept of going directly from the field to the table, and the connection between farming, food, healthcare and quality of life. In addition to credit programs, the Field to Table Institute also offers community-based courses in food, gardening, health and sustainability.

Camp highlights include Rising Stars Drama Camp, Harry Potter, Lego Robotics, Junior Musical camp, STEM camps, and culinary camps. New camp programs this year included Circus Kaput Circus camps, Sewing and Crocheting, On Brand! Visual Art Camp, and Forensic Fanatics. A couple of comments from campers were, "This place is so beautiful" (when walking to lunch and seeing the gardens, and "This was the best day EVER!" And the good words aren't limited to just campers. Here are some of the remarks left by parents on surveys:
