

## Disciplinary Infractions

Disciplinary Issue	Level of Infraction
<b>1. Disrespectful or Disruptive Speech or Conduct: Conduct of verbal, written, pictorial, or symbolic language, and/or actions including taunts, name-calling and put-downs, that is profane, rude, vulgar, defiant, considered inappropriate in educational settings or that disrupts camp activities, or behavior that is inappropriate in public settings. Students will not be disciplined for speech in situations where it is protected by law.</b>	See individual infractions

e2. Disrespect to Students or Adults to include failure to comply with the direction of an authorized College employee or representative who is performing his/her duties	1-2
e3. Profanity	2 (if sexual in nature – copy to Title IX Coordinator)
e4. Inappropriate Interruptions to include disruption of the education process or related activity	1
e5. Discussion, gestures, or sharing materials of an inappropriate nature.	2 (report to Title IX Coordinator if sexual/gender based in nature)

G. Aggressive Behavior	1-3, depending on nature (see 2E for serious offenses)

i1. Entering restroom of opposite gender	2-3 (report to Title IX Coordinator)
i2. Pushing other students into opposite gender restroom	2 (report to Title IX Coordinator)
i3. Inappropriate horseplay or bullying in restroom	2-3 (report to Title IX Coordinator if appropriate)
i4. Misuse of materials in restroom (soap, towels)	1
i5. Trashing or vandalizing restroom	2
J. Creating or contributing to unsanitary conditions	1-2
K. Stealing	2-3
L. Rules Violations to include a violation of the terms of any discipline imposed in accordance with this procedure.	1-3, depending on nature (see 2G for serious offenses)
M. Harassment or Discrimination	2-3, depending on nature (see 5A for serious offenses) (Report to Title IX Coordinator if sexual/gender based in nature)

N. Inappropriate use of technology to include computers, cellphones.	1-3, depending on nature (see 4C for serious offenses)
O. Use of electronic devices in camp (cellphones, pads, iPod, etc.)	1-2, may result in loss of privileges to bring phone to camp for balance of camp.
<b>2. Dangerous Behavior: To behave in ways that create a situation that could result in physical injury to one's self or others or in property damage</b>	See individual infractions

<b>3. Public Display of Affection/Sexual Activity: Physical contact that is inappropriate for school setting</b>	See individual infractions

B. Consensual touching (of a sexual nature) or fondling	3 (report to Title IX Coordinator)
C. Simulated Acts of Sex	2-3 (report to Title IX Coordinator)
D. Acts of Sex	3 (report to DPS/Title IX Coordinator)
<b>4. Sexual or Violent Misconduct</b>	See individual infractions
A. Forcibly or intentionally touching oneself or another person's body or clothing in a way that constitutes or results in sexual contact	3 (report to DPS/Title IX Coordinator)
B. Forcibly or intentionally acting in a violent or harmful manner toward oneself, other students or staff	3 (report to DPS/Title IX Coordinator if sexual or gender based in nature)
C. Electronic sexting	3 (report to DPS when appropriate/Title IX Coordinator)
D. Possession or display, electronic or otherwise, of sexually explicit, vulgar, or violent material to include but not limited to pornography, depictions of nudity, violence, or explicit death or injury, or sexual acts. Student is responsible for all content on their phone regardless of where the content was originated.	3 (report to DPS/Title IX Coordinator)
E. Indecent Exposure	3 (report to DPS/Title IX Coordinator)
F. Removal of Attire	2-3 (report to Title IX Coordinator)

G. Obscene language, sexually suggestive comments or actions, inappropriate references of a sexual nature, obscene gestures	3 (see 5A for serious offenses)(Report to Title IX Coordinator)
H. Violent language, suggestions, references, or gestures	3 (report to DPS when appropriate)
<b>5. Other Illegal Conduct</b>	
A. Harassment/Discrimination: Conduct which constitutes harassment or abuse that threatens the mental well-being, health, or safety of any individual	3 (report to DPS)(report to Title IX Coordinator if sexual or gender based)
I. Possession, use, or distributions of an illegal or controlled substance, or drug look-alike	3 (report to DPS)
J. Possession, use, or distribution of any alcoholic beverage	3 (report to DPS)
K. Possession, use, or distribution of any tobacco or e-cigarette type product	3 (report to DPS)
L. Trespassing or unauthorized use of property	2-3 (report to DPS if severity dictates)
M. Any illegal/criminal act not specifically defined in this policy.	3 (report to DPS)
