## Top 3 Ways Earning Your Bachelor's Pays

(1) More Options

Earning a bachelor's degree opens up the possibility for managerial and professional roles. The compensation for some occupations at this level, like financial managers, computer software engineers and marketing/sales managers is competitive with advanced roles that require more education.

Greater Lifetime Earnings

Bachelor's degree holders earn on average \$17,500 more annually than those with associate degrees, which amounts to \$540,000 or 31% more over the course of a lifetime. Registered nurses earn \$260,000 more over a lifetime if they have a bachelor's, while accountants/auditors with a bachelor's have lifetime earnings of approximately \$800,000 more than their counterparts with associate degrees.

3 Lower Unemployment Rates

For individuals over the age of 25, the unemployment rate is 2.5% for bachelor's degree holders versus 3.8% for those with an associate degree.
