Scholarships Support SCC Nursing Students

Giving scholarships to nursing students is a priority for the Friends of SSM St. Joseph Auxiliary, and their support has made a lasting impact on students and the patients they serve.

More than 120 members, made up of retirees and other volunteers, are dedicated to the mission. Marilyn Bock, Auxiliary president, joined the group when she retired from her nursing position at SSM Health. The Auxiliary has been around for more than 80 years.

Fundraisers, like the sale of Mother's Day planters, allow them to support scholarships and a number of projects that enhance the hospital's ability to care for patients, visitors and employees. The planter sale was back on this year after a hiatus in 2020. Bock hopes their meetings, trips, Christmas luncheon and trivia night events will be back soon too.

Other projects they supported recently included upgraded emergency room security cameras, clothing for people who come to the Emergency Room and may not have anything to wear, blanket warmers and more.

The Auxiliary provides three \$1,000 scholarships to St. Charles Community College students each year.



SCC Men of Color: Student Success Program receives \$20,000 from Midwest BankCentre

Orvin T. Kimbrough, chairman and CEO of Midwest BankCentre, believes one's agency, not the color of their skin or the circumstances into which they were born, should decide how fast and far they can go.

When he heard about St. Charles Community College's new Men of Color: Student Success Program, he saw a great opportunity to make a difference.

"The Men of Color: Student Success Program is specifically designed to act as an accelerant to help young black men succeed," explained Kimbrough, "a group that has historically and currently has comparatively lower college graduation rates."

That's why he helped secure a \$20,000 donation from Midwest BankCentre to help jumpstart the program.

"My hope is that this scholarship fund can help change people's lives by giving them greater access to financial resources and other supports that give them the best shot at winning," he said.

The Men of Color: Student Success Program at SCC is specifically designed to support minority high school students as they navigate through the college experience and into a life of success. The program includes financial scholarships, academic support, social engagement, mentorship and connections with successful community leaders.

Building for the Future

Voters showed support on Aug. 4, 2020, for Proposition Community College, with more than 67 percent voting yes. In March 2021, SCC broke ground on the new Department of Public Safety building on campus. Future bond issue projects include a workforce and technical building, additional STEM labs and a redesign of student services.

A ribbon cutting in August marked the grand opening of the new Culinary and Agricultural Center located on the Dardenne Creek Campus, thanks to a state grant. The building, previously a gym, was transformed into a space that features a bakery, test kitchen, commercial kitchen and brewing lab. The Center was named a finalist in the St. Louis Business Journal's Building St. Louis Awards 2021. The campus renovation was regionally recognized in the Public/Private Project Less Than \$10 Million category based on its community impact and design.







SCC Celebrates 35th Anniversary

A long tradition of support from the community began more than 35 years ago when voters approved the formation of the St. Charles Community College district on April 1, 1986.

SCC held its first classes in June 1987 with nearly 400 students. By the fall 1987 semester, 1,547 students were enrolled in credit classes, and other non-credit, continuing education programs were taking shape. Groundbreaking for the first phase of building construction took place on June 6, 1990. The new four-building campus was officially dedicated in a public ceremony on Jan. 26, 1992. Since that time, SCC's campus has been through three additional construction phases.

SCC expanded its campus operations to Dardenne Prairie in February 2017. The SCC-Dardenne Creek Campus was officially dedicated in May 2018.

In April 2019, SCC broke ground on a new student housing facility on campus. In January 2020, the first students moved into the Campus Lake Apartments, ushering in a new era for SCC as a residential campus.

Today, approximately one out of every five St. Charles County high school graduates attend SCC.

Giving Remains Strong

Giving remained strong this year, in the face of the COVID-19 pandemic. As SCC took a **hybrid approach** by offering classes remote, online, and a few in person, support for scholarships and academic enhancements continued.

Results were up this year for **Giving Tuesday**, the annual giving day after Thanksgiving, with more than \$7,000 in gifts; and the Be Transformed Gala & Auction continued the trend of online giving, when it moved to the virtual format in the spring.

The existing **Student Emergency Fund** administered through SCC's Office of Student Life, received additional donations to provide one-time assistance to students affected by COVID-19 in need of necessities to help them complete classes.

When the state offered the annual **enhancement grant** funding, the Foundation Board approved \$25,000 to add to the amount SCC was eligible to get matched by the state for curriculum enhancement, instructional equipment, facility improvement and educational resources.

As we continue to push forward, we appreciate everyone coming together this year to support our mission. With an increasing number of students, faculty and staff receiving COVID-19 vaccinations, SCC plans to be fully back on campus this fall.

Employee Gives Back through Memorial Scholarship

Thanks to Bob Ronkoski, SCC chief of police, a criminal justice scholarship is helping community college students prepare for careers as police officers, investigators and victim advocates or is giving students a start to the education they need to transfer to a university.

Bob established the James F. Ronkoski Memorial Scholarship in 2008 in honor of his father, who inspired his own career path in law enforcement.

Bob's father served as a military police officer in the U.S. Army in both the Korean War and the Vietnam War. He earned two Meritorious Service medals, a Purple Heart medal and a Heroism medal. When he retired as a first sergeant in 1968, James worked as a police officer for the City of Brentwood, Mo., until he retired.

Bob began his own education at a community college. He earned an associate degree, a bachelor's degree, a master's degree, Missouri Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) certification and has worked more than 40 years in public safety and law enforcement.

At SCC, Bob encourages staff in the Department of Public Safety to be service-minded, both on campus and in the community. They help students and employees in many different ways on campus, to ensure needs are met.

Currently Bob also is serving as the mayor of Cottleville, Mo.


