



Graph 5.6 shows that financial aid dollars from Pell Grants have remained the largest financial aid revenue source for SCC and has remained a steady amount for the past three years.

The large increase in "All Other" financial aid funds can be attributed to CARES funds being allocated to support students.

The percentage of Full-Time Students Receiving a Pell Grant Award looks at the number of students who were full-time at some point in the year and received a Pell Grant. Since 2017-2018, the percentage of full-time students receiving a Pell Award has increased.





Graph 5.7 shows that the percentage of total operating revenue from financial aid has increased over the last 5 years.
