BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN NURSING

The Bachelor of Science degree in Nursing at Maryville University is a 4-year, **freshman entry-level program**. This means that students admitted to the program as freshmen will be guaranteed a space in the program. As a result, space for transfer students is limited and early application is strongly encouraged.

Transfer students who have completed the appropriate course work will also be considered for a limited number of spaces available at the sophomore level.

To be considered for admission to the program, students must meet the following requirements:

- Admission to Maryville University
- Cumulative GPA of at least 2.75 on 4.0 scale
- ACT composite score of 22 (ACT scores not required for students having completed 24 or more college credits)
- Documentation of health requirements

ADMISSION PROCESS

- Submit application for admission to Maryville University and \$25 non-refundable application fee
- Submit official transcripts from all colleges or universities attended **NOTE:** high school transcripts and ACT or SAT score are required for transfer students who have completed fewer than 24 credit hours

The following St. Charles Community College courses can be applicable to the Maryville degree, but may NOT shorten the length of time necessary to complete the program, unless admitted to the sophomore level:

HUMANITIES/FINE ARTS

Two courses – choose two 3-hour courses in LIT, PHL, ART, MUS, THE or Foreign Language (6)
