- Students interested in the practical nursing certificate program must meet with an Allied Health Advisor alliedhealth@stchas.edu
- Students must meet the prerequisite requirements to apply for admission to the practical nursing certificate program.
- Admission to the practical nursing program is selective and dependent upon passing a background check and drug screen.
- Students must have and maintain health insurance throughout the nursing program coursework.
- All science courses for the program must be fewer than five years old at the time of admission.
- LPN Program requires MAT 096 or placement into MAT 098

### Some Important Things About Pathways..

- Before registering for courses, make an appointment with an Academic Advisor. They will help make sure you're taking the right courses and sticking to your path.

- 3. To organize courses for your upcoming semesters or to register online, visit the Student Planning App in the SCC Portal.
- 4. The order in which you take your courses may be important. Please check with your **Academic Advisor** to make sure you're not forgetting about course **prerequisites**.
- 5. If you have questions about your Financial Aid eligibility, contact a Financial Aid Counselor.
- The courses in this map were hand-selected to help you achieve your educational goals, which often includes course transfer.
   SCC does its best ensure all courses transfer, though transferability is always up to the transfer institution. (See Core42 for exceptions to this rule.)
- 7. The simplest plan is for you to **stick to the path**. Changes to maps can be made, but please speak with an advisor, a teacher, and/or potential transfer institutions to ensure your substitutions fit your educational goals and needs.
